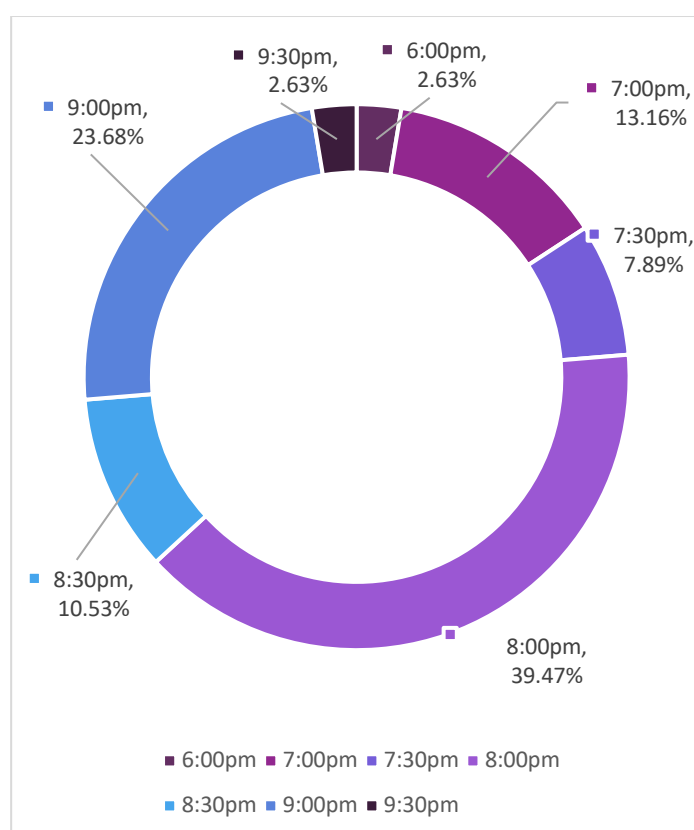
# Observed NGO Curfews

## South Sudan | February 2022

The NGO Forum conducted a survey from Friday the 4<sup>th</sup> of February to Monday 7<sup>th</sup> of February to determine if NGOs were still observing curfews in 2022 and the curfew timing.

A total of **38 INGOs responded** to the survey and they all indicated that they had a curfew policy in place.

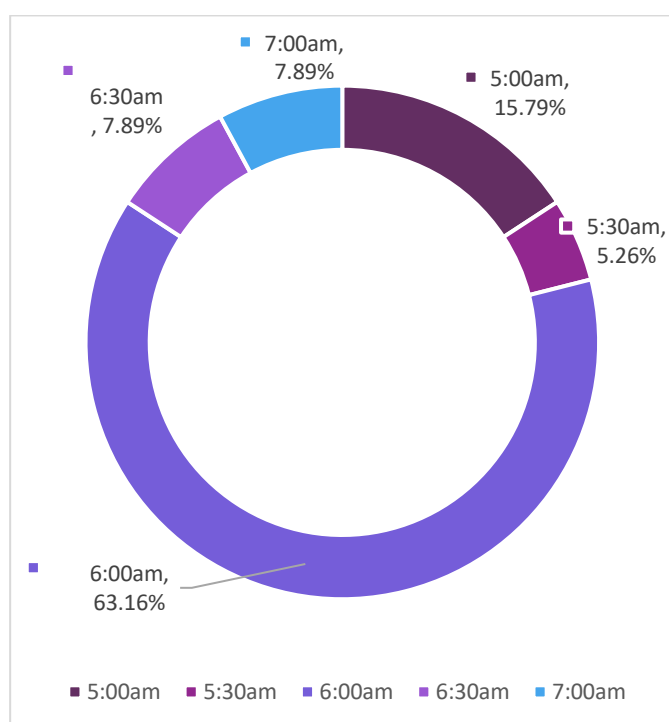
### Curfew Starting Time



Curfew Start	Frequency	Percentage
6:00pm	1	2.63%
7:00pm	5	13.16%
7:30pm	3	7.89%
8:00pm	15	39.47%
8:30pm	4	10.53%
9:00pm	9	23.68%
9:30pm	1	2.63%
Grand Total	38	100.00%

The majority of the respondents **39%** begin their curfew at **8:00pm**; with the earliest curfew start time being **6:00pm** and the latest curfew start time being **9:30pm**.

## Curfew End Time



Curfew End	Frequency	Percentage
5:00am	6	15.79%
5:30am	2	5.26%
6:00am	24	63.16%
6:30am	3	7.89%
7:00am	3	7.89%
Grand Total	38	100.00%

The majority of the respondents **63% END** their curfew at **6:00am**; with the earliest curfew end time being **5:00am** and the latest curfew end time being **7:00am**.

## Recommendations

The above survey gives a general trend of curfew timings observed by NGOs and from the responses provided, what the majority of NGOs are practicing is good enough.

The GRSS has not provided any written directive on curfew timings in a while, however from a security point of view the NGO Forum advise NGOs to have their own curfew policy in place. Important to note is that it is preferable to start curfew at last light and end on first light, or keep the curfew timings within this bracket.
