S/NO.	Date of Holiday	Holiday/Event	No. of Days	Remarks
1.	January 1 st	New Year	1 day - Saturday	Celebrating and observing the dawn of the New Year, reflecting on the past and ushering in hope for the future.
2.	April 15 th – 18 th	Easter Holiday	4 calendar days Good Friday to Easter Monday	Christian commemoration of the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.
3.	May 1 st	International Labour Day	1 day - Sunday	International Day recognizing the role of workers in development.
4.	May 3 rd – 6 th	Eid-El Fitr	4 calendar days Tuesday to Friday	Muslim holiday marking the end of the fasting month of Ramadan. It is to be noted that the beginning of this holiday depends on sighting of the new moon.
5.	May 16 th	SPLA Day	1 day - Monday	The day a unit of South Sudanese soldiers rebelled in Bor Town leading to the subsequent birth of the SPLM/A
6.	July 9 th	Independence Day	1 day - Saturday	The day South Sudan became an independent nation.
7.	July 9 th – 12 th	Eid Al-Adha	4 calendar days Saturday to Tuesday	Muslim sacrificial festivity marking the end of Hajj, the annual Muslim pilgrimage to Mecca.
8.	July 30 th	Martyrs' day	1 day - Saturday	The day the founding Chairman of the SPLM died in a plane crash. The day is marked for commemoration of all martyrs.
9.	December 24 th - 27 th	Christmas Holiday	4 calendar days Saturday - Tuesday	Christian holiday that marks the Birth of Jesus Christ.

Note: Exact dates for Easter and Muslim holidays are determined by Christian and Muslim calendars respectively.

1.	9 th January	CPA Day - Sunday	The day the CPA was signed between NCP and SPLM/A in Nairobi, Kenya.
2.	8 th March	International Women's Day - Tuesday	To sensitize Societies about the crucial role women play in their family and nation.
3.	20 th March	International Earth Day - Sunday	To focus attention on the need to protect the environment.
4.	7 th April	International Health Day - Thursday	To raise awareness on how to look after our health.
5.	25 th April	World Malaria Day - Monday	To raise awareness on eradication of Malaria.
6.	3 rd May	Freedom of Expression Day - Tuesday	The day when the media celebrate the right of freedom of expression.
7.	12 th May	Mothers' Day - Thursday	The international day for remembering and honouring mothers.
8.	4 th June	African Child Week - Saturday	To draw attention to the plight of neglected African children.
9.	10 th June	Fathers' Day - Friday	The day for remembering all fathers.
10.	12 th June	Child Labour Day - Sunday	Awareness on elimination of the worst form of child labour worldwide.
11.	16 th June	African Child's Day - Thursday	Commemorated annually to remember the African Children in Soweto, South Africa, who were brutally massacred in 1976 by the then Apartheid regime during a protest for their right to be taught in schools in their language rather than Afrikaans.
12.	20 th June	International Refugee Day - Monday	To raise awareness about the suffering of refugees and problems that drive them away from their countries.
13.	12 th August	International Youth Day - Friday	A day the United Nations have set aside to remind all Governments to carry out their obligations on Youth issues.
14.	1 st -7 th September	Public Service Week - Thursday - Wednesday	A week for public service institutions to account to the public by displaying their services to the public.
15.	21 st September	International Peace Day - Wednesday	To draw attention to the importance of international peace and promote it by addressing conflicts through dialogue.
16.	18 th October	El Moulid El Nabawi - Tuesday	The day marking the birth of Prophet Mohammed.
17.	24 th October	UN Day - Monday	The day the UN came into existence.
18.	1 st December	World Aids Day - Thursday	A day of public awareness on HIV/AIDS.
19.	10 th December	Human Rights Day - Saturday	The day the United Nations has set aside to remind all institutions in the member states to observe all aspects of human rights.
